SCAN Program

*20 schools served

*5,021 students

Teen Moms

*6 clients, plus 3 dads, in Loudon County. Pre and Post-test show an 80% level of comprehension of information presented, as compared to testing prior to course.

*5 clients in Meigs County. Pre and Post-test show a 100% level of comprehension of information presented, as compared to testing prior to course.

Agency Satisfaction Survey Summary - Clients

*178 Agency surveys collected

*More than 80% Agency surveys "strongly agree" with the CAC's ability to provide services in a timely manner, professionalism, improving the condition of the victims in our community, providing a child-friendly environment and improving relationships with community partners with only 4 surveys reflecting a "disagree or strongly disagree" rating.

Client Services

*346 clients served, including drug-endangered children (DEC)

*82% of victims were between 3-12 years of age

*57% of children were abused by immediate family members

*34% of children were abused by extended family members (cousins, aunt)

*27% of children were abused by parent's paramour or other known person

*93% of the victims we served were abused sexually

*60% of the victims were female

*758 Therapy Sessions, more than 80% show rate
